

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

- 1. The Club shall have five (5) classes of membership
  - a. Associateb. Regular
  - c. Family
  - c. Family d. Life
  - e. Honorary
- 2. Persons over the age of twenty-one (21), and of good moral character and who show a sincere interest in the purposes for which this Club was formed, shall be eligible for membership.
- 3. All proprietary rights and/or interests in the Club shall be vested in the Regular, Family, and Life Memberships. Associate members may not vote, hold office, nor apply for cabin or berth rights. Honorary members shall be eligible to participate in all social and recreational activities, but may not vote, hold office, nor apply for cabin or berth rights.
- 4. Associate Membership Applications:

Editor's Note: John Hunter has suggested we run excerpts of our Club's By-Laws in our monthly Newsletters. So, here's our first article.

Thanks for the suggestion, John!

- a. The applications of candidates for membership in the Club must be signed by two (2) Regular, Family, or Life members. The application signed by the applicant and the sponsoring members shall be presented to the Club secretary with the initiation fee, current quarterly dues and gate key deposit. It will then be forwarded to the Membership Committee for its action according to ARTICLE XII Section A 1-c.
- After a thorough review of the Membership Committee's recommendation, the Board of Directors shall either approve or deny the applicant's request for membership.
- 5. Associate Membership:
  - a. The approved applicant shall become an Associate Member upon approval by the Board of Directors.
  - b. The Associate Membership shall be for a period of six (6) months.
  - c. For due cause, the Associate Membership may be terminated at any time by the General Membership. Any fees or deposits paid in advance shall be refunded.
  - d. The Associate members <u>MUST</u> be reintroduced at the General Membership meeting preceding the General Membership meeting at which their membership is to be voted on.
  - e. At the termination of the probationary

- period, the Associate Member shall be voted on by the eligible voting membership present at the General Membership meeting for Membership in the Club.
- f. A negative vote of twenty-five (25%) percent of the votes cast shall be required to reject the associate's request for membership.
- g. If Regular or Family Membership is denied the initiation fee, any dues paid in advance and gate key deposit shall be refunded.
- 6. Regular Membership:
  - a. Shall enjoy all rights and/or privileges of the Club.
- 7. Family Membership:
  - a. Shall consist of a husband and wife, who shall enjoy all rights and/or privileges of the Club.
  - Sħall have one undivided vote per membership, exercised by either member.
  - c. A Regular Member wishing to transfer to Family Membership shall apply to the Board of Directors, for approval, and pay the difference between the initiation fee for Regular and Family Membership plus appropriate additional dues.


