
Thanks again to everyone who worked so hard in 2004 to make our Club the best in the Delta.

ARTICLE XII

A. COMMITTEES: 1.The Commodore may from time to time appoint persons for such

Standing and Special Committees as may be deemed necessary and appropriate. In addition, the Commodore shall appoint persons for the following standing committees:

a. The Entertainment Committees:

1. Shall consist of a Chairperson who shall have charge of certain scheduled social functions of the Club and, if necessary, has the responsibility to form a committee of assistants to help put on these events.

b. The Bar Committee:

1. Shall consist of a Bar Manager who shall have charge of the Club Bar and, if necessary, has the responsibility to form a committee of assistants to help with that operation.

2. Shall be operated under the strict rules

of the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control and the Bar Manager at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.

c. The Membership Committee:

1. Shall consist of three (3) or more Regular, Family or Life Members who shall investigate all applicants for membership. At the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors following receipt of the applicants application, the Membership chairperson of the Committee will make their recommendations to the Board of Directors.

d. The Nominating Committee:

1. Shall consist of three (3) Regular, Family or Life Members who shall propose nominees for the offices named in Article VII A-1, 2.

e. The Grounds Committee:

1. Shall consist of a Grounds Keeper who shall be responsible for maintaining the Club grounds in a satisfactory condition and, if necessary, has the responsibility to form a committee of assistants to help maintain Club grounds. f. The Equipment Committee:

1. Shall consist of an Equipment manager who shall be responsible for maintaining the Club equipment in a satisfactory condition and, if necessary, has the responsibility to form a committee of assistants to help maintain that equipment.

g. Audit Committee

See Article VIII A-5.

h. Budget Committee

See Article VIII A-6.

To say that our intrepid, senior moment member was stunned at his good fortune after he returned sans trailer would be metaphor.


"The only thing," lamented one member, "was there were no cameras around." ... Aaah the fates!
