Historian's Notes Kathie Hammer


The following is from a Sportsmen Bulletin dated January 1941:

# Notice for All Sportsmen!

This notice is regarding termination of the vessel cleaning program and we are asking for your help. For more than 30 years, there has been some type of boat washing/detailing program to mitigate fall-out from the power plant stacks from the PG&E power plants. Marina operators and vessel vendors were advised by email that the Boat Wash Program was discontinued effective December 6, 2013.

On Thursday, December 12th, there was a powerpoint presentation by NRG at CCC Mary Piepho's office. Also in attendance was Federal Glover, CCC Supervisor District 5, just about every harbor master in the area, and marine related business owners. Every attempt is being made to get the program back. There will be more meetings in January about this matter.
