

as Sportsmen, we can party with no pressure. This is also one of our favorite events. Everyone brings a potluck dish and has a good time.


By the way, Corned Beef is coming in March!

HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

I would like to continue our Club's History Part X from our Club's bulletin dated October 1975.

The previous articles explained how, with the financial aid of many members, Sportsmen, Inc. purchased seven acres of waterfront property. It was pointed out that the Clubhouse 'Sausalito' was moved in and a 100 x 30 foot area was dredged out. This was indeed a great time for rejoicing. It was also a time for hard work. The job was tackled collectively by all members with the usual zest and ambition that had secured the Club in past years. This task, however, was an undertaking motivated with a newer zest and ambition. All members also realized that by owning their own land and facilities they could not help but reap the harvest of their diligent toil. The members also realized that at last their efforts were being expended for their own benefit. A sculptor will take a lifeless mass of clay and, with the deftness of his creative hands, mold and shape a statue that will live in his mind and often in the minds of others as a masterpiece in art of his own vision.

The members of Sportsmen, Inc. with their seven acres of land, hull of the Sausalito, and an abundance of vision began to sculpture their masterpiece on the banks of the San Joaquin River. A look at one of the old newspaper clippings dated April 1, 1939, will give some idea as to the scope of their vision. The article quotes the then president Roy Hanford, announcing plans for a boat harbor, shaded picnic grounds, good beach, card rooms, dance hall with an orchestra playing nearly every weekend and sufficient cabins on shore to augment the cabins on board. These are to be individual housekeeping quarters with running water and electric lights. This was a vision that would truly be a masterpiece if it could be created without over-stepping the financial bounds that had been self imposed.

In Memory Of...

Helen Davidson passed away, apparently from a heart attack, on December 19, 2014. She became a part of our Club in 1980. In 1987, Helen and a group of other women whose husbands held membership at our Club became a part of what we now know as Family Membership. We have a painting of the Ferry at the Club that Helen donated "In Honor of the Women Who Helped Make Family Membership a Reality." In 2004, Helen became a Regular member; in 2007, she became an Honorary member.

Helen's mother contracted polio while pregnant with Helen and was confined to the polio unit when Helen was born. She later told stories of how Eleanor Roosevelt visited her mother, delivering yellow roses to the polio patients. When she was two years old, her parents moved to Salinas where the family bought a piece of land and the whole family, including the kids, built their family home. In 1953, Helen married Wilmer Davidson. Helen made many friends through the years; one of her dearest longtime friends was our own Arline Collins (they knew each other since 10th grade). The members of the Club became like second family to the Davidsons. She loved fishing and boating. Helen loved baking cookies and spending time with her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She was an avid reader and loved watching old movies—the kind where kids had manners, men were chivalrous, and love meant something. She would tell stories of a time when wagons delivered ice because no one had refrigerators, how the Franciscan Friars would camp near her childhood home, and how the Friars shared the Word of God with her and brought her family to the Lord.

Our sincere sympathy to Helen's family and friends.
