Publication Director Bill Needham reminded us the 82nd edition of the Yachting Yearbook costs less than two trips across the Golden Gate Bridge. It is a valuable source of information for anyone interested in our yachting community.

Regional Affairs Director Jack Michael announced a new government affairs committee can be accessed as a direct link on PICYA's site.

Captain Neil Buschman of the U.S.C.G. announced that as of March 1st they will be expanding. There will be 2000 coasties on duty. We were reminded to stay 100 yards from U.S. Naval Vessels, HIV (High Interest Vessels), 25 feet from piers, pilings of Bay Bridge and Golden Gate Bridge. A question was

asked, "How do you recognize an HIV?" The answer: They are usually escorted by a Coast Guard boat. Don't look for HIV painted on the side of the vessel.

Director Raynor Ysuneyoski of the Dept. of Boating and Waterways reported their budget was untouched and they were actually getting more money this year. To date, Parks & Recreation has borrowed \$26.6 million. We all need to keep our eye on this loan and make sure the payback doesn't slip through the cracks.

Legislative Advocate Jerry Desmond reported as of Feb. 21 there were 2500 proposals for 2003. An overview can be (Continued on Page 5)

The dredging contract has been signed for a landlocked harbor, 100x300 feet. Four feet at low tide and dredging a cradle for moving of the club house. Everything we do now in the way of improvements will be done for ourselves, not for a landlord. SO LET'S PITCH IN FELLOWS AND MAKE THE BEST CLUBIN NORTHERN CALIFORNIA A LOT BETTER. IT WON'T TAKE LONG IF WE ALL DO OUR SHARE. It is taking a certain amount of money to make down payments on equipment for our new harbor. The results so far have been very gratifying, yet there are some who have not seen fit to help as yet. The Board of Directors are not asking for gifts of money to the club, but are giving a legal note to each member who loans money to the club. So more money is needed NOW.


