HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

For the next two months, I would like to give you the history of the Levi Strauss & Company jeans. It seems appropriate since they were invented when our Ferry was bringing people from the gold fields to San Francisco for supplies.

May 20, 1873, was the day Levi Strauss and Jacob Davis received their patent for their riveted pants. In May, it will be 166 years since the San Francisco clothing company first made them.

The inventor of the blue jeans was Jacob Davis. Davis was a tailor living in Reno, Nevada, who began using rivets to make miners clothing more sturdy.

Davis wrote to his supplier, Levi Strauss in San Francisco in 1872, asking him for help to get a patent for his invention. Strauss paid \$68 for the patenting fee.

They were awarded the patent in 1873 and blue jeans were born. Originally called "waist overalls," they sold for \$3 a pair in 1873. Sales soared to the miners in California.

The original jeans had buttons for suspenders and a button fly. This was nothing new in the 1870s. The Levi's button changed over the years, from a silver style in the 1870s to a darker bronze color in the early 1900s and a hallowed out version to save materials during World War II. Also, the pocket rivet and crotch rivet were permanently removed during World War II.

In 1886, the two-horse leather patch was first used on overalls. It wasn't until the 1950s that the two-horse logo was no longer made of leather, but a less expensive heavy duty card stock.

In Memory of Larry Pacheco



We are saddened to report the passing of Larry Pacheco, on February 17th, at the age of 92. Larry Melvin Pacheco was born on September 27, 1926. Larry and Dee joined our Club in 1971 and they quickly became involved in many aspects of our Club. In 2001, Larry and Dee became Life Members. Throughout the years, Larry served as a Director on the Board, Entertainment Chairman for Luau parties and other events, organizer for Super Bowl pools for many years, and a player for our Club in game events at annual 4S competitions. In later years, he and his son-in-law, Bob, were aces for the Gold Medal in Wii Bowling.

He was the second son; his older brother was Gil Pacheco; then came his sisters, Dolores (Swart) and Muriel (Telles). At the age of 4-1/2, his arm got caught in a washing machine wringer and, from that time on, he did not have the use of that arm. So, he had to teach himself to do everything with only his left arm and hand.

Larry and Dee married on November 16, 1946, and had three children, Melvin, Kathy (Kaiwi), and Gary. Larry was a truck driver for 38 years, a part of the Teamster's Union, until he retired in 1988. They purchased the only home they ever owned in 1960 on Hillsborough Drive in Concord and lived there until last year when he sold it to move up to Oregon to be with Kathy.

They owned a boat named Lar-a-Dee and Larry was well-known for often catching the winning catfish in our annual fishing derbies. Sometimes his catch was pretty small, but he learned early on to post it on the derby board because so often even the smallest catfish would win! Everyone else was trying to catch sturgeon or striped bass, so they didn't bother fishing for catfish.

Sportsmen Yacht Club was a family affair for Larry's family with his brother, sisters, and daughter all being members. He loved our Club and our members loved him. We will truly miss his presence.

Our heartfelt sympathy to all his family.
