PICYA Report

A memorial service for PICYA Past Commodore Ward Cleaveland, age 95, was held at St. Francis YC on March 20, 2004. To say that Past Commodore Cleaveland was an inspiration is an understatement. He was never too important or too busy to help any man, woman, or child.

In 1968 to 1969 when he was Commodore of PICYA, he opened Delegate Meetings to women and championed the service of women as yacht club officers. He was a major force in forming RBOC and in 1968 he became RBOC's first president. In 1984, he became involved in a project that culminated in the construction of the "Californian," our state's Tall Ship. He was very active in providing scholarships so students of diverse backgrounds could sail on the Californian to gain experience in teamwork and self-reliance. He was also a significant force in promoting recent visits to San Francisco Bay by Tall Ships from around the world.

Peter Cleaveland, of whom he was most proud, has been named Grand Marshall of Opening Day on the Bay. Ward Cleaveland will be honored with a memorial trophy

Jean Novinger came to the rescue, not only making her a copy of an 1892 costume but also making her a new nose. She now stands proud in our museum.

If you look at Sauceylito's left arm, she is holding an authentic silver bag from the middle 1800s. This bag belonged to Gloria Batchelor and Yvonne Lackey's grandmother, Catherine Cardinalli.

Catherine came to California as an immigrant from Italy, via Ellis Island. She was a very young bride at the time bringing with her this very lovely silver bag. She lived with her husband and family on the Delta in a Houseboat until the family home was built.

Gloria wrote to me, "We think it is so wonderful that part of our grandmother's memory will still be on a boat on the Delta."





ARTICLE V

A. MEETINGS:

1. All meetings of the General Membership and

Board of Directors shall be held at the clubhouse of the Corporation on Wilbur Avenue, East of the City of Antioch, Contra Costa County, California.

- 2. The regular meeting of the General Membership will be held on the first Friday of each month at 2000 hours. If said Friday should fall on a legal holiday weekend, the meeting will be held at the same hour on the second Friday of that month.
- 3. The annual meeting of the General Membership for the election of Officers and Directors shall be held on the first Friday in November, except when such date falls on a legal holiday weekend, whereupon the meeting shall be held on the second Friday of that month.

4. The regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be determined by the Board of Directors at its first meeting following election and shall be a set day and time posted on the Bulletin Board and noted in the monthly newsletter. The Board shall meet for a period of one hour immediately following each General Membership Meeting at which time it will hear items of Club business from the membership.

B. SPECIAL MEETINGS:

- 1. Special meetings of the members of the Corporation may be called at any time by the Board of Directors, the Commodore, the Vice Commodore, the Rear Commodore, or any five (5) Board of Director members, or by twenty-five (25%) percent of the membership.
- 2. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called at any time by the Commodore, Vice Commodore, or any three (3) members of the Board of Directors.
- 3. Notice of a special meeting for the General Membership shall specify the

purpose, place, date and the hour of the meeting. The name or names of the member or members or the Officers or Directors calling the meeting will be included in the notice. The notice of the special meeting shall be sent by mail to the membership at least five (5) days prior to the meeting. The notice of the special meeting shall be given to the Club Secretary or other member designated by the Commodore for distribution. No subject other than the stated purpose, or purposes, shall be considered at special meetings.
