In the 1930's, you would see long lines of people at the Northwestern Pacific Railroad's ticket window in the San Francisco Ferry Building. It would start at 7:00 am as vacationers bought tickets to travel to vacationland along the Russian River. These people where heading for Monte Rio and Guernewood Park. The big sliding door would open at exactly 7:45 to board the ferry boat to Sausalito where you climbed aboard the steam trains. The gate keeper would call out, "All Aboard for Point Reyes, Tomales, Occidental, Camp Meeker, Monte Rio, Duncan Mills, and Cazadero Narrow Gauge Train Number 8." It would only take about 3 minutes to load the ferry. Then with a huge splash the giant side wheels would start to turn and she was on her way.

As a child I heard many stories from my mother how her family would take this trip to Monte Rio and they would rent a cottage for the summer. Those were the days.

#### **A True Phoenix Story**

Many from the Bay Area boating community remember the Metropolitan YC of Oakland (MYCO), located in Oakland's Jack London Square. Unfortunately, because of the Loma Prieta earthquake and the City of Oakland's redevelopment plans, MYCO lost its clubhouse about ten years ago and its membership dissolved. Since then, MYCO existed primarily on paper because of the valiant effort of Past Commodore Jack Raney who paid the PICYA dues out of his own pocket for years to keep the name and burgee alive in the hope that one day MYCO would be revived. The once proud and mighty club lay dormant as merely a name, a burgee, and a long and colorful history without a location or membership.

In early 2009, Lizette Collins recalled hearing there was a group in Alameda that had looked into starting a yacht club but was unsuccessful in getting it off the ground. She approached the PICYA Membership Committee Chair with an idea to make this a win-win situation for the Alameda group, the PICYA and for MYCO. Lizette, along with MYCO's Past Commodore Gary McGrath and his wife, Estella, contacted John Beery of Mariner Square and Associates in Alameda. With John's permission and support, they began work on restoring the Metropolitan and its new location in Mariner Square. Lizette saw to it that MYCO's suspended nonprofit status was restored by the Secretary of State and she then filed ten years of delinguent State and Federal tax returns while begging the IRS to forgive over \$400 in fines, which they did. Calling on her friends in the yachting world, Lizette then embarked on a membership drive that hasn't been seen in Bay Area boating circles in quite awhile. She recruited a fine Bridge and Board of Directors which was elected during the Metro's first general membership meeting in ten years last October. As of this writing and because of her continuous effort, the Metropolitan YC has over 60 members and boasts a fleet of more than 25 boats. On January 9, 2010, Lizette was sworn in and installed as Metropolitan YC's 43rd Commodore at the club's location, upstairs at the Pasta Pelican's banquet hall in Alameda, before a crowd of more than seventy friends and members.

Congratulations to Lizette for successfully and tirelessly pursuing her vision to revive the Metropolitan YC. Well done!
