HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

Literally millions of people commuted on the Bay in the 1930's. Many of them became good friends and celebrated many occasions on the ferries.

Food was very important to the ferry riders. In 1938, you could order Pot Roast of Beef for 45 cents, Homemade Corned Hash was 40 cents, a cup of Beans was 25 cents, and a piece of Homemade Pie 10 cents.

The ferryboat passengers were able to get quick smooth connections to where they were going.

The ferry system worked so well because the schedule of ferryboats was matched by the schedule of streetcar and cable car connections to most of the city. In 1930, 43 ferryboats transported a total of 47 million passengers and more than 6 million automobiles across the Bay.

It was often said that ferryboat passengers had more fun on their twice daily trips than any other commuter.

The 95th Annual "Opening Day on the Bay" Decorated Boat Parade, hosted by the PICYA, representing over 100 yacht clubs in Northern California celebrates the official beginning of the 2012 boating season on San Francisco Bay. This year's theme is "American Spirit" honoring the many people and events that have made San Francisco so unique.

Retired Captain Jan Tiura, the first female tugboat skipper on the Bay is this year's Grand Marshal. The parade will feature over 120 historic workboats, fireboats, towboats, classic and contemporary craft decorated to the theme. There will be both power and sail boats competing for best decoration honors.

These boats can be viewed by the public along the San Francisco waterfront from Crissy Field to Pier 39, 12 noon until 3 p.m. The occasion will be a unique opportunity to see these special boats, sailing close to shore. This is an event for the whole family to enjoy, learn about boating and the America's Cup which will be held in San Francisco in 2013.

DELTA FOCUS

Following are excerpts from Bill Wells' "Delta Rat Scrapbook" article in the March 2012 issue of the Bay & Delta Yachtsman magazine. To read the complete article online, go to: www.yachtsmanmagazine.com.

"... In addition to the above Department of Water Resources attack on the Delta, I told you last month about the Department of Fish and Game wanting to wipe out the striped bass because of a lawsuit filed by the Coalition for a Sustainable Delta.

Now, once again we find the Natural Resource Agency wanting to eliminate the Department of Boating & Waterways (DBW) and put their activities under the direction of the Department of Parks and Recreation. The Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC) organization is on top of this and the last I heard they had a stack of letters about 18 inches high protesting this scheme that they are delivering to the governor."

(Note: Over 95 of the letters referenced above came from Sportsmen YC! Thank you to everyone who supported this vital issue.)

"The Fish & Game Commission held a meeting at the Natural Resource Agency building in Sacramento to decide the fate of the striped bass. A few water exporters and their lackeys spoke in favor of changing fishing regulations that would effectively wipe out the striped bass and some 35 people spoke in favor of keeping the existing regulations.

Hundreds of fishermen and other interested citizens attending the meeting.

In the end the commission voted unanimously to keep the existing regulations in place. Commission Chair Jim Kellogg went so far as to declare the striped bass 'a native species.'"

(Once again, thanks to Restore the Delta, The Striped Bass Association, and Sportsmen members who attended this meeting.)
