## HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

The ferry boat *Contra Costa* was built in 1914 at the Southern Pacific yard in Oakland and was eventually dismantled in 1930. The *Contra Costa* was known at the time as the largest ferry in the world. She carried passengers and railway cars across the Carquinez Strait between Port Costa and Benicia where the Sacramento River meets the northern part of San Francisco Bay. Open at both ends, the ship's deck had rails that linked directly with a railroad track at both terminals, allowing trains to roll directly on board or off.
