HISTORIAN NOTES KATHIE HAMMER



More from an article written by Jacob Stadtfeld from our friend **Bill Knorp**:

Mr. Stadtfeld wrote that during the summer before 1941, the

year ferry service between San Francisco and the Marin County communities was discontinued, he was a "regular" aboard the many ferryboats operated by the Northwestern Pacific Railway. He can remember the pleasures of relaxation and conviviality enjoyed by commuters before the advent of the Golden Gate Bridge.

He remembers the old double-ended and double-decked ferryboats Sausalito, Tamalpais, Cazadero and occasionally the Ukiah or Tiburon were all on the San Francisco to Sausalito run. They would be considered quite slow in these fast times. It took 25 to 30 minutes to make the crossing on a clear day, depending on the tide, and perhaps 10 minutes longer when the fog was bad.

The time consumed in making the crossing was sufficient to allow for complete relaxation.

passengers would Many read newspapers while others visited with friends. Inside the cabin of the main deck, friendly and sometimes noisy card games would be going on. Boards, stored in racks at the end of the rows of seats which ran crosswise to the deck were provided for the convenience of the passengers. The players supported the boards on their knees and if games were not completed at the end of the trip, they would be continued on the return trip. To get the proper seats and a playing board, one of the foursome would run down the gangplank and board the ferry as soon as the gate or door was opened. This was usually backed up by cheers.


Say, did anybody notice? "Bronco guy" is now Mr. "Cadyman." He needed a better ride for Mom and you can bet she deserves it.

PORT CAPTAIN COMMENTS JIM DAWSON



Now that we have a waiting list for cabins, I would like to expound on the correct procedures for cabin requests. When a member is interested in

getting a cabin, they must fill out a Cabin Request Form and submit this form by giving it directly to the Port Captain or placing it in the Port Captain's mailbox. The request will be dated and timed when the Port Captain receives it. The time and date of the request will determine the member's order on the cabin list. This is the only way to get on the cabin waiting list. A \$75 non-refundable deposit is required at the time the cabin is awarded. Writing your name on the list posted or telling someone your desires will not get you on the list. Only Regular, Family and Life members request cabins. may Associates must wait until they become Regular or Family members.

After a member receives a cabin they can sign up to transfer their cabin by filling out a Cabin Transfer Request. This form must also go to the Port Captain and will be dated and timed. All cabin holders deciding to give up their cabin should fill out a Notice to Surrender Cabin Request Form and turn it into the Port Captain. Cabins surrendered back to the Club will first be offered to those (by date and time) who have signed up on the Port Captain's transfer list. After said list has been gone through, the cabin will be offered to the first person on the Any two members waiting list. wishing to trade cabins must submit in writing to the Board of Directors their requests. I hope this answers any questions for new members on how to request a cabin.




