





I know many of you have bucket lists. I was able to check one off my list in March. Keith and I spent two nights on the Delta King in Sacramento. I have written about the Delta King and Delta Queen several times and her grand past, so being able to stay on her was very exciting.

The historic Delta King is a real riverboat. She is 285 feet long and has an identical twin sister named the Delta Queen. Both of these riverboats were christened on May 20, 1927, and began their daily trips from San Francisco to Sacramento in June of that year. Promptly at 6:00 pm each day, ladies and gentlemen boarded the grand sternwheelers and started a 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour trip where they enjoyed drinking, dancing, gambling, and fine dining. A stateroom was \$3.50, but for a dollar you could use your own blanket and spend the night on deck.

The King and Queen cruised up the Sacramento River until 1940. By this time the roads were improving, bridges and automobiles were more efficient and faster than the grand riverboats. Because of the Depression and World War II, it was the end of the stern wheel era. Both the King and Queen were drafted into the U.S. Navy. They served the San Francisco Bay as floating barracks, troop transports and hospital ships.



Thanks to your support, our Club was able to present a check to RBOC at the last Delegates' meeting.



Dave Davidson passed away on April 20, 2016, after a long battle with Alzheimer's Disease and Prostate Cancer. Everyone who knew Dave loved him. As a young, handsome sailor from Illinois, Wilmer Wayne Davidson stole the heart of a beautiful California girl named Helen Louise Cruysen. In 1953, they were married and, in time, had a family of four children. Over the years, the family had many interests and in 1980 they came to Sportsmen YC with many of their friends from Anchor Marina. In later years, Dave and Helen separated and lífe changed.

In September 2006, Sportsmen YC actually became Dave's primary residence when he married Trella, our Caretaker for many wonderful years. "Davey" as he was affectionately called, wore many hats at Sportsmen, including being a Director on the Board, PICYA representative, Treasurer's Assistant, Bar Assistant, and Jack-of-all-Trades. Most importantly, he was everyone's friend who was always willing to help.

Alice Gibson recalls that Dave would jump in the dumpster with her to help stomp down the garbage—making room for more. Don Lucido remembers conversations with Dave about astronomy; Dave had the demeanor of a regular kind of guy, and yet he was very intelligent and loved things scientific.

In 2008, Dave & Trella moved up to Galt to be near family. Five years ago, Dave was diagnosed with cancer. For the past several years, Trella has lovingly cared for Dave through the frustration and illness that Alzheimer's and cancer causes. Finally, just a few days before he passed, she allowed Hospice to be called in to help her care for him.
