DREDGING NEWSFLASH

If you have not already heard, we now have all of our dredging permits. By the time you read this, many members will have been putting finishing touches on the dredging preparations. The actual dredging is set to begin at 2:00 p.m. on August 1st. During the dredging process, boats berthed in the various sheds may need to be re-tied. Some boats may be temporarily removed from their berth to facilitate maneuvering of the dredge. When the sheds are moved, all boats will remain in their berths. If you are going to use your boat during the dredging period, please check with the dredging team for the dredging schedule.

The Poker Run scheduled for Saturday, August 9th, will still be held. We expect to pull the dredge and pipes out of the way for this event.

Dredging will stop for this year on or before September 14th.

FROM OUR REAR COMMODORE DARLENE DAWSON





At the April 8, 2003, Council Meeting, a report was heard on the initial findings of the Northeast Antioch Annexation Feasibility Study. As the study area is comprised of both residential and

industrial parcels, staff had recommended two concurrent annexation applications whereby the residential parcels vote separately from the industrial parcels on the decision to annex.

At the time of the presentation to Council, preliminary investigations had shown the industrial area to have less than 12 registered voters allowing for an uninhabited "annexation," which is less cumbers ome than an inhabited "annexation." However, field work since the April 8th Council Meeting has shown the industrial area north of

Wilbur to have more than 12 registered voters all living in the easterly section.

As a result of this new information, the Contra Costa County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) has suggested the city submit three separate annexation applications. The area north of Wilbur Avenue, formerly thought to be uninhabited, will be split into two areas, one industrial and the other residential. The third area would be the mainly residential area north of East 18th and along Vierra Avenue. Each of these three areas would separately vote on the issue of annexation. In the residential areas annexation will be determined by a majority of registered voters while assessed parcel value will determine the annexation vote in the industrial area.

This information is posted on the Club Bulletin Board for your careful review. All input and questions would be greatly appreciated.

From the book, "Of Walking Beams and Paddle Wheels," by George Harlan and Clement Fisher Jr., I learned that one of the traditions of the San Francisco Bay, in the early

days, was the decoration of the ferry boats on holidays and other special occasions.

Besides carrying banners of every color, all of the old-time boats were equipped with a house flag, a vessel flag, a nd a commission pennant. On special outings, bunting was put up around the upper deck, and at Christmas time garlands of greens were draped on railing and house fronts. Each vessel had a tree on the masthead and one in the cabin. The vessel decorations served to reflect the pride the crews had for their boats. There was competition between the boats even though there were no prizes.

The ferrymen took every opportunity to display their vessel in the best possible light.

Vessel Missing

Date Line: 2003 4S at Bethel Island

During a high speed racing contest, a boat was reported missing. According to witnesses, the vessel was last seen entering Sandmound Slough. Later information indicates the vessel was listing to one side and subsequently sunk.

Rescue craft were immediately placed on alert! After repeated calls on 911-1/2, the vessel was assumed lost.

Search teams were dispatched and the missing were identified as **Barbara Chapman** and fellow racer **Paul Larosee** of Sportsmen Yacht Club.

At approximately 11:44 a.m., the vessel appeared at the San Joaquin Yacht Club. The vessel captain (Ms. Chapman) claims, "A mysterious force lifted us into a vortex somewhere in Sandmound Slough." They were "retained in an unknown location for what seemed to be days," the Captain reported.

Somehow they were transported back to the race course and were again seen at the "Granada Dock." Ms. Chapman claims no knowledge of the missing 10 minutes.

Local authorities have been alerted and suitable warnings posted.
