

First on the list is a fine shore fishing wharf with a windbreak, comfortable seats and a guard rail. This improvement has been needed for a long time, now we have an attraction for those who do not care to go out in boats. A new gangplank has been built to the land end of the clubhouse, also a retaining wall is being built constructed along the lower levees. All of this was done on Sunday, July 30, 1940. It seeme.d as though everyone just felt like working."

The Meeting Night Dinner was a spectacular braised pork chops and vegetables prepared by **Ben** and Char Best, assisted by Mike Transchel.


We had a serious Work Party after the July meeting. The crews continued to work on the dredge, getting ready for the August

ARTICLE VIII GENERAL POWERS OF THE BOARD OF

DIRECTORS:

1. The Board of

Directors shall manage the affairs of the Club, control its property, enforce the preservation of order and compliance to its By-Laws, Rules and Regulations. They shall have the power to appoint or remove all managers, agents, or employees of the Corporation. They will prescribe duties and fix, reduce, or increase their compensation.

2. They shall have the power to lend, to invest all or any part of the capital of the Corporation whenever they shall deem such action for the best interest of the Corporation, provided such a transaction has been presented at a General Membership meeting, published in the Club bulletin, and then by a written affirmative majority vote of the eligible members present at a regular or special called General Membership meeting. 3. They shall have the power to adopt Club rules and regulation consistent with these By-Laws for the purpose of providing ways and means for the operation and conduct of the business and affairs of the Club. Likewise, they shall have the right and power to change them as conditions dictate, subject to General Membership approval.

4. No indebtedness shall be binding upon the Corporation unless authorized by the Board of Directors. When so authorized, the note or obligation given for same, and any instrument executed as security therefore, shall be binding upon the Corporation. The authority for incurring such indebtedness may be a general power conferred upon an Officer or Agent of the Corporation, or by resolution specifically stating the terms and amount of such indebtedness.

5. They shall appoint an Audit Committee or procure the services of a recognized public accountant to provide for an annual audit of the Club financial record and/or at any time they shall deem an audit is necessary.

6. They shall appoint a Budget

Committee to present a budget for the following year.

7. Minutes will be kept of the Board proceedings to provide a monthly report on the condition of the Club to the General Membership.
