On April 18, 1906, at 5:13 in the morning, an e arthquake violently shook the people of San Francisco from their sleep. The magnitude was 7.8

and, almost immediately following, the city was engulfed in fire which burned for four days. The quake was felt from Coos Bay, Oregon, to Los Angeles and across the state into central Nevada. The zone of destruction was 400 miles long and 25 miles wide.

As many as 3,000 people died in those four days.

The San Francisco Bay Ferryboats played an important role in the 1906 earthquake by carrying passengers who had lost their homes to other cities around the bay.

The San Francisco Marina district, built largely on fill, collapsed in the earthquake.
