RBOC News Flash!

California Governor Jerry Brown recently signed into law AB 1829, legislation supported by RBOC and sponsored by the California State Sheriffs' Association that clarifies current state law pertaining to boating under the influence (BUI). This law is part of a continued effort to increase safety on our state's waterways.

According to the 2013 report of the state Division of Boating and Waterways, 32% of all boating fatalities in the state involved alcohol during the period 2009 to 2013.

The provisions of the measure will take effect on January 1, 2017. Details are on the RBOC website.
