Historian's Notes Kathie Hammer

Did you ever wonder how our armed forces got their songs?

In the Elks magazine (May 2019) they had a wonderful article explaining just that. This article will be continued over the next two months. Here are the Stories Behind the Song for the U.S. Marine Corps, Navy, and Air Force:



The U.S. Marine Corps - The oldest of the service songs is "The Marines' Hymn." The Marines did not officially adopt this song until 1929, even though much of the song's lyrics and music originated in the 19th century. The exact origins of the song "From the Halls of Montezuma to The Shores of

Tripoli" have been lost to history. "The Marines' Hymn" was first published by the Leatherneck, a Marine Corps magazine in 1919, and a decade later was adopted by the U.S. Marine Corps as its official song.



The U.S. Navy - Unlike "The Marines Hymn," the origins of the song for the U.S. Navy, "Anchors Aweigh" is well documented. The song was originally composed as a fight song for the football team of the U.S. Naval Academy. After being played a many

games the song was gradually adopted by the Navy in 1926.



The U.S. Air Force – "The U.S. Air Force Song" predates the creation of the U.S. Air Force as its own branch of the armed forces. During World War II, the air forces of the U.S. military existed within the U.S. Army as the U.S. Army Air Forces and as the U.S. Army Air Corps prior to that. It was during

the time of the Air Corps, in the late 1930s, that the service's famous song about "The Wild Blue Yonder" was composed.


