FROM OUR VICE COMMODORE DARLENE DAWSON

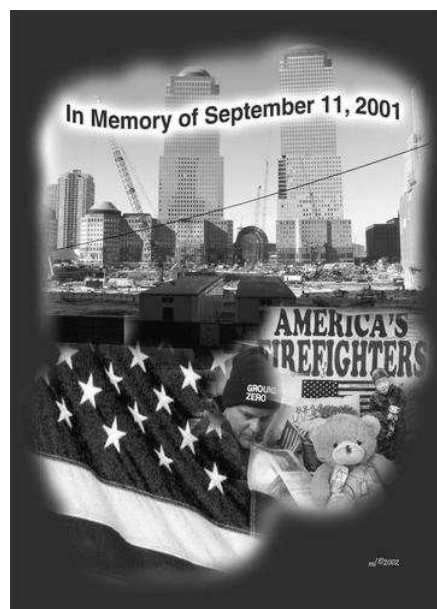


It is exciting to see the enthusiasm of our new associate members and to see so many who want to become a part of our Sportsmen family. This is also a

Unsung Heroes

On the morning of 9/11, thousands of men and women on or near the waters of New York Harbor answered the U.S. Coast Guard's call for "*All Available Boats.*" This spontaneous maritime effort was the largest wartime evacuation since Dunkirk in WWII.

Ferries, tugboats, inflatables, private vessels, and even the historic John J. Harvey answered the call. In one day, these vessels and their crews evacuated more than 300,000 people from Manhattan Island. They pumped water from the harbor to feed hoses, brought in needed supplies, rescued people in the water, and they ferried fire fighters, police, medical, and emergency service workers to Ground Zero.

These heroic and selfless maritime volunteers are just one more testimonial to the courage and strength of the American spirit.

HISTORIAN NOTES KATHIE HAMMER



From a Sportsmen Bulletin dated September 1941, the following was reported:

"Our boat manager and his gang are building a substantial

bridge across the ell end of the harbor and a motor room will be built at the levee end of this bridge, this will provide another cabin space for someone and also allow large cruisers to back in and gas up at the visible gas pump which will be installed. The above improvements are just a few of the many projects that have been started, completed and paid for in the past two and one half years since we purchased the property and moved to our present location.

Just visualize the place as it was on March 1, 1939 and then look at it today. It sums up to hundreds of work days and thousands of dollars. We thank our hard working boat managers and the equally hard working members for all of the improvements."

- *Tim Doolin, we're glad you're feeling better and thankful your test results were good news.*

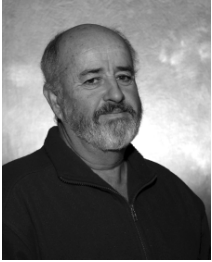

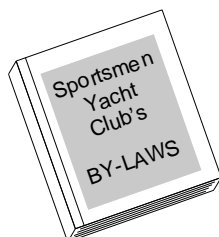

ARTICLE IX

A. DISCIPLINE OF AN OFFICER OR DIRECTOR:

1. Any member, in good standing, may charge an Officer or

Director with misconduct or conduct detrimental to the welfare of the Club. Such member shall submit, in writing with signature affixed, to the Club Secretary a description of such alleged offense(s). Commodore shall immediately call a Special Meeting of the Board of Directors, in Executive Session, to ascertain validity of charges. The accused Officer or Director shall be excused from all duties and meetings until said charges are resolved. If determined the complaint has merit the Board shall schedule a hearing. Ten (10) days prior to such hearing written notification shall be sent to accuser and accused of the nature of the complaint, date, time, place of hearing and invite each to appear before the Board of Directors. At the conclusion of the hearing Board shall render a decision.

Vote shall be by secret ballot. Removal from office shall require a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Upon written demand of the accused the matter shall be referred to the next General Membership Meeting for the Board's decision to be affirmed or overruled. To overrule the Board's action a Two-Third (2/3) majority of the eligible voting membership present shall be required. Accused Officer or Director may address the membership prior to vote. Vote shall be by secret ballot.

ARTICLE X

A. ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS:

1. Election shall be held annually at the General Membership meeting in November and shall be for the following terms:

- a. Each Flag Officer position, one (1) year;
- b. Secretary and Treasurer, one (1) year.
- c. Directors, two (2) elected each calendar year for two (2) year terms.
- d. There shall be no restrictions as to how many terms a member may hold or

run for office.

2. All elections shall be by secret ballot. If there is more than one nominee to be elected for an office, the nominee must receive a majority vote to be elected. In the event of a tie vote, the deciding vote shall be cast by the Commodore or Acting Commodore.

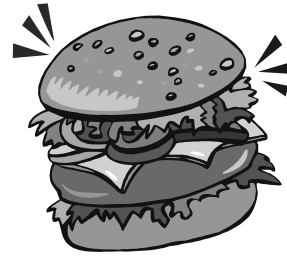
