

For yachting, he said it was the Silver Star Award awarded to him by PICYA in 2003. This award is based upon commitment, dedication, and valuable service to both PICYA and the recreational boating community.

Pacific Inter-Club Yacht Association (PICYA) of Northern California was organized May 12, 1896, and incorporated in 1958. The purpose of this "non-profit mutual benefit corporation" is to "constitute an association of yacht clubs and boating organizations, to promote inter-club communications, yachting activities, and social interaction." PICYA actively works with the U.S. Coast Guard, Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC), and the California Department of Boating and Waterways to provide programs for water safety, education, and legislation. Communication is achieved through the Yachting Yearbook, the Log (a bimonthly newsletter), spring and fall conferences, monthly delegates' meetings, and the web site (which can be accessed at www.picya.org).

Annual regattas provide inter-club competition and fun for all ages and skill levels. Whether you are watching or participating, Opening Day on the Bay is an experience to behold. Humanitarian events such as the Wheel Chair Regatta offer yacht club members an opportunity to share their boat and love of the water with disabled enthusiasts. This is a brief overview of PICYA purpose and activities.

As announced at our August meeting, President Bush recently signed the Clean Boating Act Legislation which permanently restores the 35-year exemption for recreational boats from proposed EPA permitting requirements. This means new permits for boats are not required!

RBOC monitored this legislation closely while it was in process. "This act will restore the exemption for 18 million recreational boats across the nation to be exempt from having to comply with onerous federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) permitting requirements for vessel discharge. RBOC, BoatU.S. and NNMA have worked diligently to pursue passage of this legislation." according to PICYA's July 2008 LOG.


The next PICYA meeting will be held on September 8th at San Joaquin Yacht Club.
