In my first article for our newsletter, I said I wanted to find a way to honor our original incorporation goal of introducing youth to the outdoors and fishing. At our August meeting, I shared my idea for community service with Kathie Hammer. She liked the idea and said she would support it if the Club decides to move forward with the plan. My idea is to have a weekly visit to the ferry from a 4^{th} grade class. I chose 4^{th}

grade because that is the year students study California history.

Each visiting class would be split into three groups of about 10 students each who would rotate between three stations spending about 20-25 minutes at each station. The first station would be inside the ferry where Kathie would give a history lesson about our ferry, the Bay and the Delta. Another group would be on the pier where volunteers would allow the students to do some hands-on testing of the water. The students would learn about the health of the Delta and threats to the Delta while doing some fun experiments. A third group would be taken to the guest dock (with life jackets and chaperones) where they would learn about food chains and ecosystems while fishing for bluegill. Volunteers would bait and cast the poles for the students. From past experience, I could just about guarantee that everyone would catch and release a fish in about 10 minutes. For many, it would be the first fish they ever caught. The students would arrive around 10:00 AM, rotate between the three stations, be done at 11:30, have lunch and be gone by noon. We would probably need at least five volunteers in addition to Kathie, three on the dock and two on the pier. We would also have the teacher and chaperones to assist. The volunteers would have to be people who are free one morning a week and those assisting the fishing portion should be able to bait, hook, and cast a pole. I could teach the pier volunteers how to do some simple water tests. I mentioned this idea at the last board meeting but it has not been officially proposed or voted on.

It is still just an idea but I thought I would throw the idea out to the membership to see if there is sufficient interest to move forward. If you are interested in volunteering, please let me know. If I have enough volunteers, I will take the proposal to the Board and see what our next step is.



HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

Recently, I received an email from a lady who was told her father was a singing waiter on one of the ferryboats between 1923-1927. I told her that I was sorry, but as far as I knew there were no singing waiters on the ferryboats. I thought about this for awhile and sent her another email stating that I had heard of a singer or singers called the "Caruso of Ferryboats."

After some research, I found this to be correct. In the book, San Francisco Bay Ferryboats, by George H. Harlan, it is written: "To the fortunate commuter or occasional traveler, who might be returning from the theater late at night, an aria from the 'Caruso of Ferries' might be his reward. Since Key System, Southern Pacific and Northwestern Pacific commuters all claimed at one time or another to have heard a stocky man standing fire watch on the lower deck with an extinguisher in a canvas bag over his shoulder, it may be assumed that more than one ferry deck hand earned this legendary title when the ferries still crossed the Bay. This author can attest to having heard a marvelous operatic voice booming out over the noise of the engine and the thump of the paddles on the steamer Tamalpais. Dick Hunter was probably the last of a long line of 'Carusos of the Ferries,' but his contribution was among the finest of them all."

I only wish I could have heard one of these arias while traveling across the Bay!


