### **HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER**

In 1915, Martinez had a Mail Stage. The driver of the horse drawn buggy sold stamps, issued money orders, and generally ran it like a traveling post office for those living in the countryside of

Prior to air conditioning, awnings shaded the windows of Main Street's beautiful buildings. The street was paved in 1918 and automobiles replaced the horse drawn vehicles.

Also, before the Martinez-Benicia Bridge was built, ferries carried automobiles across the Carquinez Strait. People would drive their cars onto the boats from a wooden wharf at the north end of Ferry Street. The name of the Ferry was the Issaguah; it operated from 1930 to 1940 and is now in Washington State.

And the big guy that kept the water coming was Big Steve.


To cap this off, it has been a busy three months of hard work, that many people have put time into. We have accomplished a lot of work, but we still have some to go. See you in the trenches....
