I hope to see more of you at Rio Vista which takes us from the end of September right into October for the Clam Chowder Cook Off!

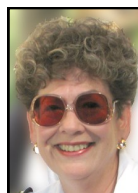

HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

On her last run, the train ferry Solano was dressed in flags and crowded with people who had walked on board the 51 year old train ferry. She completed her last scheduled run on November 1, 1930. She was built in Oakland in 1879 by the Central Pacific Railroad Company and spent her career carrying railroad cars across the Carquinez Strait on the Benicia Port Costa route for the Central Pacific and its successor the Southern Pacific Railroad. The opening of the Southern Pacific's Benicia Martinez Railway Bridge made the Solano Ferry unneeded and she was scrapped soon after.

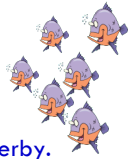

2016 Sportsmen Annual Fishing Derby Update (as of September 20, 2016)

We have 36 people entered in the 2016 Derby.

- * There is \$490 total in this Derby so far.
- * Rules are posted at the Club.
- * Associates are welcome to participate in the Derby.
- * Three categories: Strippers, Sturgeon, and Catfish.
- * Cost is \$5.00 per category.
- * For the Catfish category, Albert Perez has 1st place with a 2# 2oz. fish and 2nd place with 1# 4oz fish.
- * In the Striped Bass category, Jim Dawson secured 1st place with a 38# 12 oz. fish, Jim caught another one weighing 17# 3 oz. for 2nd place, and Jim weighed yet another one in at 16# 14 oz. for 3rd place.
- * For our Sturgeon category, William Odum is in 1st place with a 31 pounder, Rick Barton weighed in a 27 pounder to take 2nd place, and Bill Pato Jr. holds 3rd place with a 26# 12 oz. sturgeon!



Even though every month is good for fishing, the fall months are the best for catching a winner. If you're not in this Annual Fishing Derby yet, you should think about signing up because 100% of the money goes back to the fishermen and we now pay four places in each of the three categories. To sign up is only \$5 per category or \$15 for all three. You must be signed up 24 hours before going fishing. Again, this Derby goes until New Year's Eve.
