Life In Hard Times, San Francisco in the '20s' '30s" by **Jerry Flamm**. It has wonderful information about the Ferry Boats on the Bay. Mr. Flamm tells about the veteran commuters who had to be at work early and how they usually headed for the restaurant or the standup counter on the main deck for a cup of coffee. Coffee was a nickel and you could get refills and take them out on the deck to enjoy the crisp fresh air on your trip over.

The commuters knew all the nuances and angles about riding the ferries. The window seats were the most desirable, but the most experienced rider knew which windows on which ferries leaked when it rained. Puddles would form on the seats or on the floors, rolling up and down as the boat tilted and bucked through the choppy waters.

A Summary from our By-Laws...


