Article XI

(Continued)

5. The Treasurer:

a. Shall keep a written record of the names and addresses

of each member of the Club.

- b. Shall collect and have custody of all funds of the Club and shall control the disbursement of the same under the direction of the Board of Directors.
- c. Shall keep proper account books showing in detail the receipt and disbursement of all funds in the Club accounts.
- d. Shall prepare or have prepared a written financial statement which shall be read to the General Membership and presented to the Board of Directors at each of their regular meetings.
- e. Disbursements shall be made only upon checks drawn and signed by the Treasurer and one of the following:

Commodore Vice Commodore

- 6. The Master at Arms:
- a. Duties shall be directed by the Board of Directors.
- 7. The Fleet Captain:
- a. Duties shall be directed by the Board of Directors.
- 8. The Port Captain: (Boat Manager)
- a. Shall have general supervision of the Club Headquarters and of all its property. Shall have power to prescribe rules and regulations, as may deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors and the General Membership. Post these rules and regulations in a conspicuous place in the Club house and keep them up to date.
- b. Shall, with the approval of the Board of Directors, engage such employees as may deem necessary in the discharge of his or her duties. Their compensation is subject to approval by the Board of Directors.
- 9. The Harbor Captain (Harbor and Dry Storage Manager)
- a. Shall have supervision of all the berths, anchorage, dry storage and the marine ways on the Club property. He or

she shall have power to prescribe such rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors and the General Membership. These rules and regulations will be posted in conspicuous places in the entrance to each berth area and kept up to date by the Harbor Captain.


