As with any good book, as one chapter comes to an end, you anticipate the next to come. Sportsmen has now completed the task of dredging our harbor. With the vision and leadership of Commodores Lonnie Gibson, Dave Selvy and Darlene Dawson, Project Manager Carl Rasmussen found his way through miles of red tape and seemingly daunting obstacles to lead his team to a successful kickoff year of dredging. With his bulldog like tenacity, we closed this chapter with much anticipation as to the possibilities of the future. After all, we succeeded at dredging our own harbor, under budget and ahead of schedule.

I believe and want to take this opportunity to recommend the next chapter for Sportsmen YC should be an aggressive plan to replace the boat berthing areas. We have been patching, propping, and refloating for long enough! We now have all that new water under our boats and we

now need safe docks around them! Many have spent hours to weeks on repair projects that have only been stop gaps. Anyone who will take the time to walk Areas 2 & 3 will see areas that have new lumber but you won't view the areas as new. Many have talked of replacement plans but always as long term view. We no longer have the luxury of putting off this project. We also no longer need to put this project off, we have a strong membership and a great opportunity to play off our successes.

We have done an amazing job of securing our financial condition and have membership numbers and participation which will sustain the financial commitment that will be required. I am not proposing that we "break the bank," but indeed we should use the bank. Berthing is a major capital improvement to our property and it should be financed as such. If we let the initial investment sway us into tinkering at this project, we will never get it started much less completed. But if we commit to a plan that allows for a mix of short term and long term cost management, we can attack this with an eye on completion within two to three years. I understand there is a lot of ground to plow before we commit to a construction plan and system, but if we can all agree to the desired end result which would be comfortable, clean, safe and secure berthing for our fleet, then we will succeed again.

Thank you all again for reading my articles this year and I have enjoyed your comments on my rambling each month. Best of luck to the Officers & Directors of 2006. I know that through the support of the membership you will reach your goals for Sportsmen YC and be blessed in the process.
