In closing, I want to wish all of you a Happy Holiday season with good health and may all of you be blessed with a wonderful New Year in 2011!

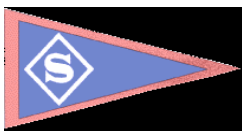


**REAR COMMODORE

HISTORIAN'S NOTES

KATHIE HAMMER

I gave a report to the membership about having the pleasure of giving a group of men from the "Steamship Historical Society" a tour of our Museum and Ferry. They loved our Museum and Ferry. Only one of them had visited the Sausalito before and that was 35 years ago. It is so rewarding to give tours to groups that have so much knowledge of the old ships of the bay. I learn as much as they do.

One of the things they pointed out were the "hog chains" on top of the Ferry. When I got home and did some research on "hog chains," the following is what I found out: "Hog Chain is a system of chains and rods to prevent wooden hulls from sagging, or hogging under heavy loads. The hull of the western steamships tends to warp up in the middle and sag at the extremities. This hog chain system is a preventative. Hog chains extended from the forward hull, up over the hurricane deck and back down to the stern. They could be tightened or loosened as needed by means of turnbuckles."

Christmas with Santa is coming on December 11. I am looking forward to singing with the children before Santa arrives. Be sure to mark the children's presents with their name and age and have your guests write your name on the children's presents as this will help Freda to identify and get photos to the proper person.

December is Safe Toys and Gifts Month



Skates, tricycles, toy trucks and cars, wagons and balls are among children's favorite playthings. But in one year, according to U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission estimates, there were 150,000 toy-related injuries serious enough to require hospital emergency room treatment.

Falls are the most frequent kind of accident, but many serious injuries result from children swallowing small parts or placing tiny toys in noses or ears, from exploding gas-powered toys, from flammable products, and from sharp edges.

Each year, some 5,000 new toys enter the market-place. The holiday season finds over 150,000 different kinds of toys for sale in approximately one million stores. Despite the efforts of manufacturers, retailers, safety inspectors, and others, it is impossible to examine every toy. But it is possible for parents and other relatives to check every new toy they buy and every old toy around the house for possible hazards.

The following suggestions can help you keep playtime a safe, fun time.

- Be a label reader. Look for safety information such as "Not recommended for children under 3 years of age," or "non-toxic" on toys likely to end up in little mouths, or "washable/hygienic materials" on stuffed toys and dolls.
- Check with parents before you buy a child a toy that requires close supervision - electrically operated toys, shooting toys and games, chemistry sets, and the like. Remember, too, that younger children may have access to toys intended for older children once the toy has been brought into the home.
- Look for the UL (Underwriters Laboratories) seal on electrical toys. It indicates the electrical parts have been tested for safety.
