We have a couple more events left at the Club before the end of the year - one meeting, the Lighted Boat Parade and our evening with Santa.

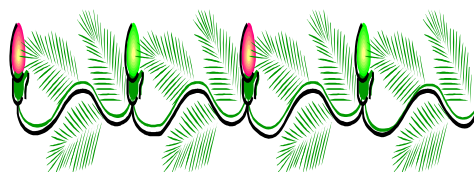

HISTORIAN'S NOTES KATHIE HAMMER

Maybe it was because I wrote about it that Keith and I took four days at the end of October to go camping at Duncan Mills. I remember as a child visiting this picturesque village and also remember my mother talking about the area in the 1920's. If you look at old photos, you can see the hundreds of people waiting for the train to take them to the ferries that took them back to the big city. Like I wrote last month, it was a very popular vacationland.

Duncan Mills was named for two brothers, Samuel and Alexander Duncan and was an established lumber mill town in the early 1870's. The brothers logged the redwood trees, which were sent by lumber schooners down the coast to San Francisco to build the beautiful Victorians there. By the turn of the century, there were several large hotels and the town was thriving.

The North Pacific Coast Railroad (later the Northwestern Pacific) came to Duncan Mills in the 1870's until the last train left in 1935. People came from San Francisco on the ferry, received their tickets in Sausalito and headed to the end of the line, Duncan Mills.

If you visit Duncan Mills today you can see the restored depot that won the California Historical Award for the best restoration in 1971. There is the original railroad coach that has been restored and placed on the tracks by the depot. In 1994 the original caboose No. 2 was brought home to be on display. After hundreds of visitors in the early days, the population is now 85.

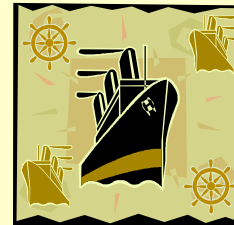

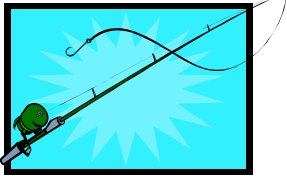

Sportsmen's Fishing Corner.....

The water is starting to cool down and get a little dirty. This is the time of the year Black Bass start to feed up and get ready for the winter. Start fishing points with current on them and access to deep water; a crank bait is a very good way to catch bass this time of year. Stay with your crawdad colored lures reds and blacks. If you have used a jig, this is also a good bait, black and blue in color on deep ledges. I like to put my boat parallel to the bank and throw a crank bait along the edges of grass beds this time of year. The next best rig for the winter is a drop shot rig.

A drop shot rig is a light weight tied on the end of your line with a hook tied about 10 inches from the bottom. Use a rubber worm such as a 6 inch Robo Worm in a MM II color, pitch it to the edge of the weed beds or the bank let go to the bottom and shake it. Chances are you won't feel the bite your rod will just load up with weight when you get a bite.

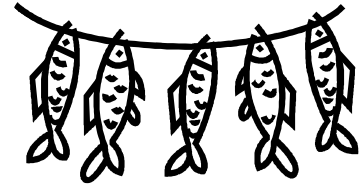
Stripers are starting to come in. There hasn't been any large schools of large fish yet, just a lot of schoolies. In the Pittsburg area, they are picking them up on Bull Heads and Split Tail. In the Sherman Lake area, a Rattle Trap and Hair Raisers are doing well. As the water warms during the day, have a Big Hammer Swimbait tied on. If the water is stained or fairly clear, have a white one and, if it is dirty, go to Chart Blue in color. If you get a couple of warm days, go out early in morning and later in the evening using a top water bait such as a Pencil Popper, Zara Spook or a Black Dog Lunger Punker. These baits will produce larger fish.

If you're going to fish the Big Break area, try between the Tully Islands in the current using the Swimbait.

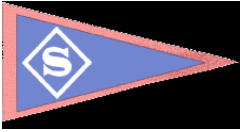
